We are committed to conducting business ethically and with integrity. While we do not maintain formal standalone anti-slavery policies due to the scale of our operations, we:

- Work with reputable UK-based suppliers where possible
- Expect our suppliers to comply with applicable laws and ethical standards
- Remain alert to any indicators of unethical practices

We will continue to monitor our business and supply relationships to ensure that risks remain low and will take appropriate action if our operations expand or risk levels change.
